Meanwhile, it is considered to be hypoallergenic because its coat usually does not trigger allergic reactions. And because the temperament of the Cavachon makes it friendly and lovable, it can serve as a companion dog and can live comfortably with children and other pets. And when it comes to food, the Cavachon loves fruits and vegetables. However, it is advisable to include dog foods that have been specially designed for small dogs to ensure that it is getting the right nutrition.
