In addition to the bonds, they also offer home appointments if requested and fax service for cosigners who are out of town. In special situations, they will drive defendants home after their release. And for those who are not yet in custody, ABC Bail Bonds has professionals who have the training to have warrants taken care of in the privacy of their office. Furthermore, they can also provide private investigations whenever such services are required.

They want to point out that bail is cash that is deposited for security of a bond that is issued by a surety company. While cash bail can usually be posted, clients often prefer to post bonds because they will only need to pay a percentage of the bail that has been set as a premium for the bond.

For the situation that the defendant skips out on bail, the surety company has the right to find and arrest the defendant when he or she is regarded as a fugitive. Upon arrest, the defendant will be taken into custody, and the contract will be considered null and void. The defendant will have to pay for all recovery efforts even though he or she has been surrendered into custody.

It should also be noted that defendants will not be able to get back the money if the case is exonerated or if they are imprisoned because posting the bond is a service. The actual purpose of the bail bond is to offer guarantees to the court that defendants will appear in court after bonds hearings. Because of the guarantee, the court will release the defendant from custody until the next court appearance or until there is a sentencing.

It should be noted that while the granting of bail is a presumed entitlement of a defendant, there are some exemptions and these are under the discretion of the judge in charge of the case.

There are several factors that a judge will consider when deciding to allow or deny bail in California. The first factor is that the person is accused of committing a crime. The second factor is that for the

purpose of deciding about the bail, the person is presumed innocent, but the severity of the crime being charged matters for the purpose of ensuring safety. When the prosecution is able to provide convincing evidence and argument that allowing the accused to be released would present a danger to the public, then bail may be denied.

In summary, the decision to deny or grant bail would be dependent on the safety and security of other people in the community. In other words, the safety of the many will trump a person's entitlement to bail.
