While dementia mostly affects older people, it is not part of the normal human aging process. The syndrome mainly affects the capacity for memory, thinking, orientation, comprehension, calculation, learning, language, and judgement; however, consciousness is not affected. The impairments in the patients' cognitive function are commonly accompanied, and occasionally preceded, by deterioration in their emotional control, social behaviour, or motivation.

Casey Rybeck, a spokesperson for Senior Care Center¹, says, “Dementia is one of the worst afflictions out there, and it is truly saddening to see families lose their loved ones little by little. It’s heartbreaking. What’s worse is the fact that, around the world, dementia seems to be on the rise. One form of dementia, specifically Alzheimer’s disease, is actually the No. 6 leading cause of death in the United States. Part of the reason for this is that people are living longer and longer today and surviving more illnesses than they used to. As you age, the risk of dementia increases.”

According to information shared by the World Health Organization (WHO), there are around 50 million people worldwide suffering from dementia, with nearly 60% of that number living in low- and middle-income countries. Every year, there are nearly 10 million new cases. Statistics also show that the estimated proportion of the general population aged 60 and over with dementia at a given time is between 5-8%. Projections for the future show that the total number of people with dementia is expected to reach around 82 million in 2030 and 152 in 2050. WHO states that much of this increase is attributable to the rising numbers of people with dementia living in low- and middle-income countries.

Rybeck says, “There aren’t many ways to directly combat dementia because scientists still haven’t managed to zone in on its root cause. While numerous new treatments are constantly being investigated in various stages of clinical trials, there is unfortunately no treatment currently available to cure dementia or to alter its progressive course.
